Wayne State had an uregetn timeline and withdrew a large number using the data-driven withdrawal lists from the MI-SPI analysis. At CMU, we communicated heavily with faculty and even staged some weeded items for them to come in to reweiw.

Susan Stearns: It is also important to note - although not time to discuss today - that EAST includes a lending network that is intended to ensure access for stakeholders at the member libraries as weeding takes place.

Susan Stearns: Yes, this is MONOGRAPHS only. EAST is, however, just beginning some serials and journals work.
